ABOUT THE PLAYS

Heading Home - a Play by Dan Stepenosky

In the wake of her father's death, a mother of two faces a challenge from her teenage children and



her own mother over where their lives are headed and what they call home.

Dead Wait - a Play by Jake Marone

When Arthur, a recently deceased accountant, tries to make his way down the jetway toward whatever the afterlife holds in store for him, he's challenged by Kylie, a surly teenage rocker whose dream of rock-n-roll stardom was cut short for no good reason. Will the Gate Agent prevail and usher Arthur on his way?

Flying True - a Play by Liz Cangelosi & Angela Cutbill

A young girl named Millie wanders the airport with her stuffed bear, Fred, and meets three women, each one living a different life at a different time and traveling to a different destination. Over the course of the play, Millie visits 1937, 1977 and 2017, and learns what makes each of these women tick, before ultimately deciding on a destination for herself.

George and Manny - a Play by Joe Hortua

Two men cross paths at LAX while waiting for their flights. When Manny, a bright, second-generation Mexican-American political science major returning for classes at Berkeley, sits down next to George, a widowed retiree and Vietnam vet sporting a "Make America Great Again" trucker hat, the brief connection between these two individuals allows them to put their suspicions about each other aside, if only for a moment.

Lost & Found - a Play with Dance by Dave Moorman

A woman on the verge of turning her life upside down to become a professional dancer waits for her flight next to a stranger who offers her some free advice on following your dreams. After she dances her way to a decision about what to do next, we learn the stranger is not at all who he seems.

Standing By - a Musical written by Gilles Chiasson, based on story by Gilles Chiasson & Larry Iser

Juliet just turned 18. She's running away from home, determined to fly across the country to convince

Romeo, her camp counselor from last summer and first "real" boyfriend, to dump his fiance and marry her. But first, she's got to get a seat on the plane. Will Juliet's number get called as the airline works its way down the standby list? Will she realize her dream of becoming a wife? Will she realize her dream of becoming a wife isn't her only option?

The Gate Family - a Play in Parts by The Ferguson Family

The (real life) Ferguson family will be portraying the "Gate Family" in NOW BOARDING, a mythical family of five who, once their flight is cancelled, spends the rest of the play searching for the right gate that will finally allow them to board a plane and reach their destination. ABOUT THE CAST

Some of the 55 actors performing in *NOW BOARDING, A Festival of Original Plays to Benefit the LVUSD Performing Arts*, will include:

Joe Spano

Actor Joe Spano, best known for his Emmy-nominated detective role on Hill Street Blues (1981), was born in San Francisco, the son of a doctor, and a Bishop Riordan High School and University of California-Berkeley graduate. His intention to be a pre-med major dissipated with the growing interest of acting. While in San Francisco he worked with the improv group The Wing. While at college he made his debut as Paris in a production of "Romeo and Juliet" in 1967 and the very next year helped found the Berkeley Repertory Theatre, appearing in its very first first production of "Woyzek." He stayed with the company for 10 years and appeared in many of its plays including "Hamlet" and "Cat on a Hot Tin Roof." In the late 1970s he decided to give Hollywood a try and in between guest shots on TV earned bit roles as hoodlums and other assorted urban troublemakers in the films American Graffiti (1973) and The Enforcer (1976). He also played a seductive vampire in the cult musical "Dracula: A Musical Nightmare" in a small LA theatre. After the success of his hit cop show in the 1980s, Spano appeared here, there and everywhere, but to less notoriety. He's had recurring roles in Murder One (1995) and NYPD Blue (1993), again as a detective. He has appeared regularly in mini-movies and other television shows as well. He made his Broadway bow in 1992 as Walter in a revival of "The Price" by Arthur Miller. In films, Spano worked alongside Tom Hanks in Apollo 13 (1995) and Richard Gere and Edward Norton in Primal Fear (1996), among others.

Bill Garrett

Bill Garrett has been a Theatre Educator at Calabasas High School for the past 18 years. He is proud to be working at his alma mater, where he found his passion for the arts. He received his Bachelor's Degree in Theatre Arts at California State University, Northridge and his Master's Degree in Education at Pepperdine University. During his time at CHS, Bill has directed over 40 productions. Bill is a strong advocate for the performing arts in education and is a board member of the Drama Teachers Association of Southern California, where he is busy helping to provide opportunities for both students and drama teachers. Awards include: LA County Teacher of the Year, LVUSD Teacher of the Year, two-time CHS "Golden C" recipient, and Los Angeles County's Most Inspirational Teacher.

Sami Harnick

Samantha Harnick is a sophomore at Calabasas High School and has been performing in musical theater since the age of 5. Samantha's favorite roles include The Woman in White in The Woman in White, Esther Smith in Meet Me In St. Louis, and Brooke Windham in Legally Blonde performed at Calabasas High School. From numerous Broadway style cabarets to the original cast of "The Hollywood High Tones," an a cappella group at Universal Studios Japan, Angela has performed all over the world. Some of her fondest memories include entertaining children as Peter Pan's Wendy at Disneyland. More recently, Angela lends her talents to various film and television series as a voice over artist and stars daily in the role of "Mom" to two wonderful boys.

The Ferguson family has lived in Agoura Hills for 3 years and plans to stay indefinitely. Four dogs, a cat, and some chickens also call the Ferguson house home. Henry is a silly and easy going little guy. He loves to build legos, write stories, read, play baseball, and is learning to play the electric guitar. His red hair has always attracted attention, but his laugh is his best quality - loud and infectious. Henry is a 1st grader at White Oak Elementary. Scarlett is full of love and wonder. She "rolls" in a pink wheelchair and makes friends everywhere she goes. Cerebral Palsy does not stop this girl from enjoying life. Scarlett rides horses, dances with Infinite Flow Kids, and is taking Ukulele lessons. She wants to be a baker when she grows up. Scarlett is a 1st grader at White Oak Elementary. Samuel is a strong-willed, superhero loving 3 year old. He wants to do everything his big brother does. He especially enjoys jumping, climbing, learning how to play sports, and eating. He also likes movies, music, theater, and dancing. He wants to be "Thor" when he grows up. He is a future White Oak Lion.

ABOUT THE WRITERS

Elizabeth Cangelosi is a 15-year Agoura resident and has worked in the area for over 30 years. By trade, Liz is a property manager, working with owners and developers for many of the local Conejo Valley shopping centers and is currently the property manager at The Shoppes at Westlake Village. She has also served on the PFC boards at Yerba Buena Elementary, Lindero Canyon Middle School and most recently as Co-President at Agoura High School. She wrote and starred in the popular 2010 Yerba Buena PFC Boosteritis ad, still in reruns on YouTube. Liz is also very proud to be part of the PAEC family, working in the Agoura PAEC box office since 2013. Liz's theatre experience



started when she took on the role of Robot #2 in the 3rd grade school play. Gilles served as Associate Director of the world premiere of WAY OF THE WISEGUY at the Chicago Center for the Performing Arts, and also directed Katya Lidsky's groundbreaking one-woman show, I'm Sorry, at The Lounge Theatre in Hollywood and the Fringe Festival in New York City. As an actor, Gilles originated roles in the Original Broadway Casts of RENT, The Scarlet Pimpernel, The Civil War, and Baz Luhrmann's La Boheme; and he performed leading roles in the national tours of Les Miserables and Forever Plaid. Off Broadway, Gilles originated roles in the World Premieres of Groundhog (Manhattan Theatre Club), Fermat's Last Tango (York Theatre), and received an Obie Award for his work in the original production of RENT (New York Theatre Workshop). Gilles can be heard on the Original Cast Recordings of RENT, The Scarlet Pimpernel, Fermat's Last Tango, and La Boheme, as well as his solo CD entitled Slow Down. As a writer, Gilles wrote the words and music for the musical play, chrysalis; and conceived and co-wrote the living newspaper revue, FISHWRAP. Gilles is a founder and Emeritus Board Member of Upstate New York's Adirondack Theatre Festival, a long-time member of the New York Theatre Workshop's Usual Suspects, and a member of Bobby Moresco Actors' Gym in Los Angeles. Gilles dedicates his work on this production and everything in his life to his wife, Sherri, and their two boys, Hugo and Beau.

Angela Cutbill has been a member of the Las Virgenes Board of Education since 2013. Born and raised in Kansas, she graduated from college there and worked for both the Kansas Secretary of State and US Senator Bob Dole. She received her MA in Post War European Economic Reconstruction and Political Integration from Durham University in Durham, England in 1987. While living in the UK she worked for Dewe Rogerson Ltd, a government relations consultancy in London, and also in the House of Commons. She and her husband, David, relocated back to the US in 1993, and have lived in Agoura Hills for over 20 years. Before her election to the school board, she was an active school and community volunteer. All three of her children attended LVUSD schools.

Joe Hortua is an American playwright and television writer. He has written such plays as Other Parents, Making It, and Between Us which have been performed at The Manhattan Theatre Club and South Coast Repertory Theatre. Between Us was translated into Hebrew and performed at the Be'er Theatre in Israel, and subsequently produced in 2010 at the Ensemble Theatre in Australia. In 2008, the play was published by Dramatists Play Service. The screen adaptation of Between Us began filming in May 2011 with stars Julia Stiles, Taye Diggs, David Harbour and Melissa George in the leading roles. Hortua has also written television pilots for the Showtime, FOX and the CW networks, and has been a television writer on shows for the FBC, ABC, NBC, NBC, TNT and CBS



networks. Notable series include: Bones, Leverage, The Night Shift, Betrayal. Joe is married with two children, both of whom attend schools within the Las Virgenes Unified School District.

Larry Iser has been a trial lawyer for over 35 years. He is a founding member of KWIKA --Kinsella Weitzman Iser Kump & Aldisert, a boutique litigation law firm in Santa Monica. He is a graduate of the University of Michigan (B.A. 1976) and the University of California, Hastings College of Law (J.D. 1980) Larry specializes in the areas of intellectual property and entertainment litigation. Larry represents a large number of very cool clients, including Mattel, Apple and SeaWorld. Larry has long represented numerous clients in the music business including The Beatles, Michael Jackson, Jackson Browne, Crosby, Stills & Nash, David Byrne, Axl Rose, The Doors, The Carpenters, The Wiggles, eBay/StubHub, The Estate of Ira Gershwin, The Estate of Janis Joplin and jazz artists including Branford Marsalis, Kevin Eubanks and Savoy Records. During his time at the University of Michigan, Larry was a member of the Michigan Marching Band and Michigan Jazz Band, and served for two years as the Music Director for MUSKET, the student theatre organization. More recently, Larry served for 5 years as President of the Reprise Theatre Company in Los Angeles.

Jake Marone is 17 years old and is a senior at Agoura High School. He has written his first play for the Beacon of The Arts benefit, and is excited to share his work with everyone. Jake's background in theatre is quite extensive, having performed in over ten plays and musicals, and being a varsity player on the Agoura High School ComedySportz team. He hopes you enjoy the event, and asks everyone to stick to their dreams, no matter the cost.

Dave Moorman has been involved in the entertainment industry since 1979, when he oversaw technology for game shows such as "Tic Tac Dough", "The Joker's Wild" and many others. For several years in the mid 1980s he served as Advertising Director for PCH sportswear, where he produced early MTV commercials and some the first fashion music videos of the era. Dave created a production company in the late 1980s and produced commercials and corporate programs for companies like Anheuser-Busch, NEC, Hilton, and Hyatt. In the 1990s he helped design several post- production facilities in the Los Angeles area, culminating in creation of Image Resources Film + Video, a full-service post facility in Woodland Hills. Dave has been a producer on a number of TV shows and independent films, and has served as Post Supervisor, Supervising Sound Editor, and Re-Recording Mixer on hundreds of hours of television and scores of feature films. As a parent and resident of Agoura Hills, Dave got involved in the Las Virgenes schools, first as a PFA president, then as a two-term School Board member (2005-2013). While serving on the Board, Dave was instrumental in moving the bond measure forward that secured funding for the two Performing Arts Education Centers, and was a member of the District's Facilities Committee, overseeing the design and construction of the PAECs. His commitment to arts in education continues as he has



served on the PAEC Advisory Committee since its inception.

Cinco Paul grew up in Phoenix, Arizona dreaming of becoming a famous pop musician. He graduated summa cum laude from Yale University, abandoned his dreams of pop stardom, got an M.F.A. in screenwriting from USC and became a screenwriter instead. Life's funny that way. With Ken Daurio he has written the movies Despicable Me, Despicable Me 2, Despicable Me 3, DR. Seuss Horton Hears a Who, DR. Seuss' The Lorax, The Secret Life of Pets, The Santa Clause 2, and Bubble Boy. He also wrote the lyrics for the six songs in The Lorax, and is the recipient of the ASCAP Sammy Cahn Award for lyric writing and the Harold Arlen Award for the score of Bubble Boy the Musical, the original cast recording of which was just released on Sh-K- Boom Records. He currently lives in southern California with his wife Amy in a house that feels really empty now that his three children have grown up and left home.

Daniel Stepenosky was born and raised outside of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Dr. Stepenosky attended Villanova University on a Naval Reserve Officer Training Corps (NROTC) scholarship. He graduated in 1990 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Physics. Dr. Stepenosky served four and a half years in the United States Navy, first on the Destroyer USS Waddell and then on the Cruiser USS Chancellorville. While in the Navy, Dr. Stepenosky was engaged in counter narcotics operations off the coast of South America and in Operation Southern Watch in the Persian Gulf. After the Navy, Dr. Stepenosky received his Teaching Credential from the University of San Diego. He taught Physics, AP Physics, Astronomy, and Physical Science at Beverly Hills High School from 1995-2000; served as Assistant Principal at Beverly Hills High from 2000-2003; and Principal of Beverly Hills High from 2003-2006. Dr. Stepenosky received his administrative credential and Masters in Education Leadership from California State University Northridge in 1999. He received his doctorate from UCLA in 2003 from the Graduate School of Information and Education Studies. His doctoral dissertation was on "Preventing School Shootings" and his research for this was conducted at Columbine High School. Dr. Stepenosky joined the Las Virgenes Unified School District in 2006 and served as Assistant Superintendent of Personnel until 2011. He was the District's Deputy Superintendent from 2011-12 and was appointed Superintendent of Schools in 2012. In 2016 Dr. Stepenosky was selected as Superintendent of the Year by the Association of California School Administrators. Dr. Stepenosky has lived in Calabasas since 2002 and has two children in Las Virgenes Unified School District.
